# Stone Age to Iron Age - 'The Big Dig'

### Phase 3

The Starter and Finisher for this topic will be conducted as a phase - parents will be invited to the finisher and will receive regular updates (from CT) of their child's class work towards this. Children will create invitations personalised to their parents to visit the final exhibition and children can dress up as tour guides etc.

Children will write in every topic lesson in order to support the development of literacy skills (a small section of writing appropriate to task). Every 2 weeks children will do an extended writing piece using the small sections they have gathered over the days prior- this is to increase writing stamina and independence. As well as an extended writing piece, each hook can include a wider curriculum outcome to display in the Houldsworth museum.

Each unit will include some specific words which should be taught, learnt and used by children in their writing and speaking in order to extend children's vocabulary.
